7. Interactive Budget Workshop

Mr. Smith reviewed the Budget Calendar for the Board. He noted that the Board of Education will present their budget to the Board of Finance on Monday, March 12th at 6:00 p.m. in the T-Bell.

Mr. Smith presented the Green, Yellow, and Red Tier totals.

Mr. Goff stated that the Board of Education is not eliminating teaching positions but are not filling vacancies caused by retirements. Mr. Smith noted that to get to the 3.35% increase we are below contractual obligations.

Ms. Clark and the Principals reviewed the 2018-19 Budget Requests that are presently in the budget and also requests not in the budget, but under consideration.

A discussion followed.

Beth Sheeley asked what the current class sizes are and what the results will be if there is a reduction. Class sizes were discussed.

Tania Sones asked how do we maintain the integrity of the East Hampton Public Schools and why should students/parents want to stay here. Once a position is cut it is so difficult to put the position back in the budget.

Ines Venetianer questioned what East Hampton's most valuable investment is. We want to keep students in the district and not have them go to magnet schools. We need to maintain our class sizes. How much money does it cost the district for the students that go to magnet schools? Is there any way to reach out to the magnet students' parents to find out why they chose to send their children elsewhere.

Joseph Smith, an East Hampton High School student, noted that a wide range of courses is important. Having electives and advanced placement courses is important.

Ms. Kuck, stated that if the High School lost a Math teacher it would desecrate the Math department. Ms. Kuck urged the Board to look at and provide opportunities to students that want to take advantage of the rigor.

Kristin Whitney, an East Hampton High School student, noted that if the Board cuts advanced placement classes and a student wants to go into the medical field they will be held back.

Ms. Barmasse noted that she would like to see a clear sense of what each department looks like and what it can look like with eliminations.

Mr. Goff noted that next week the Board will need to go through each of these items in order to meet the March 1st deadline. If you have any questions or recommendations please send them to Mr. Smith.
