 current events at their respective schools.

4. Audience of Citizens

4.1 Public Forum: Impact on Schools in Town Referendum #4 Mr. Smith noted that the referendum is tomorrow. Mr. Smith noted that we are wrapping up the town budget hopefully tomorrow and begins the process of submitting the Board of Education budget by March 1, 2019. Mr. Smith reviewed the compromise proposal by the Town Manager and the Superintendent of Schools. Question #1 approves the budget and #2 makes the transfer in order to hire 2 teachers. There will also be 2 advisory questions – Is the general government budget too high or too low? Also is the BOE budget too high or too low? 4.2 Budget Input: Request from school community for consideration in 2019-20 Budget

Mr. Smith noted that this is the opportunity for the community to suggest/recommend items for the 2019-20 budget.

6th Grade Student – chrome books are important. We need more Language options. For developmental guidance that helps children have a better attitude and accomplish more. We should have longer periods.

Grace Michalowski, 60 Haddam Neck Road, stated that she loves the music program taught in all 4 schools, especially the Choir program. She returns to school every Monday night for Choir practice. Ms. Michalowski requested that a full time choir director be added to the budget. This would get more kids into the music department.

Julien Minnick suggested a full time choir director be added to the budget. Mr. Brown's teaching position is only .8 and the students would benefit if it was a full time position.

Isabella Del Orfano, Barbara Ave., spoke in support of a full time choir director. Mr. Brown and the music program makes her want to come to school.

Victoria Kelpen 11 Oak Knole Road, spoke in support of a full time choir director. She noted that Mr. Brown is a great teacher.

Serenity LaChance, Matthew Lane, spoke in support of a full time music director. She gets to study music theory at her magnet school but East Hampton High School students do not. East Hampton students could take music theory if Mr. Brown's position was full time.

Ethan Valencia, 28 Colchester Avenue, spoke in support of a full time choir director and reviewed possible programs that students could have to the opportunity to take if Mr. Brown's position was full time.

Sharon Owen, 33 White Birch Road, spoke in support of making the .8 choir director position to full time. This will allow additional music programs at the High School. She noted that her daughter Serenity goes to Hartford Magnet School for the music program. She wouldn't have to go to a magnet school if East Hampton had a better music program.

Sherry Bannack, a High School Teacher, spoke in support of the reinstatement of the math teaching position that was eliminated.

Bob Hine, 19 Birchwood Road, spoke of some budget cuts. Mr. Hine noted that he had the opportunity of going to China with the Superintendent and 38 other people. He was surprised to see that 1st grade Chinese students are in English classes. We can't even get foreign language classes available for students in 5th grade. We are now in a rut of trying to get by without what is necessary.

Dr. Joe Ochterski, Science Team Leader at the High School, spoke in support of the AP Biology Textbooks. He noted that 22 additional AP Biology textbooks would cost approximately \$4,014.14.

Brandy Kauffman, East Hampton Football Club, noted that football is not part of the school's budget. If we don't get enough support we won't have a football program. Her son was put on probation due to his grades.

Christin Flannery, 8 Flannery Row, noted that last year's budget cuts eliminated an English Teaching position. Now there are only 5 teachers teaching English. Classes average 25 students or higher. It is almost nearly impossible to work one on one with students to improve their writing skills.

Katie Tietjen, High School Library/Media Specialist, spoke in support of a High School Library/Media Specialist.

Sherry Labowski, K-5 Math and Science Specialist, spoke in support of breaking her position into two positions.

Tania Sones noted that students need to be engaged and teachers need to reach out to students. A substance abuse program is needed in our schools. Chrome books are now the new textbooks. Ms. Sones noted that she really hopes the Board is able to incorporate the chrome books in the schools so that every student could have one.

Amy Ordonez, noted that the Smart Start Preschool Program is an 8 year program and we are presently in the 2nd year.

Mr. Rizzuto requested the following: restore the High School English Teacher and Math Teacher, increase the High School Music Teacher from .8 (PT) to 1.0 (FT), add a High School Cooperative Work Experience Teacher/Coach, new textbooks for AP Biology, Add AP Music Theory, AP Physics and AP Computer Science. Include partial High School Football funding in the Athletic Budget, add a School Resource Office housed at the High School but serving all schools, add an additional High School Security Personnel and upgrades to technology software and upgrades to the High School Auditorium.

Mr. Lehmann requested the following: Restore the Middle School World Language Teacher, Middle School Literacy (Reading) Support Specialist, add a Special Education Teacher, restore the Middle School Library Media Specialist, add Middle School Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM) Coordinator/Supervisor, add a Middle School Math SRBI Tutor/Interventionist, Restore the Middle School Department Head Stipends and an increase to the Middle School Developmental Guidance Program.

Mr. Sullivan requested the following: Add a guidance Counselor and create a STEM-Markerspace-Coding Lab.

Mr. Gonzalez requested the following: Add World Language Teacher for Grades 3—5, add Reflex Math Program, restore Memorial School Literacy (Reading)Specialist, add Special Education Teacher to support K-1, add Special Education Teacher to support 2-3, add Memorial School Math SRBI Tutor/Interventionist, add Data Team Leaders and Grade Level Team Leaders and add "Fundations" K-1 Phonics Program Mr. Mosier requested that a Board Certified Behavior analyst (BCBA) be added.

Ms. Clark requested the following: increase Curriculum writing K-12, enhance Professional Learning/Development, PK-12, add additional AEDs to all schools and add Emergency Trauma Response Kits to all schools.
