12.1 Healthy Food Certification

Motion to approve the Healthy Food Certification:

Pursuant to Section 10-215f of the C.G.S., the East Hampton Board of Education certifies that all food items offered for sale to students in the East Hampton Public Schools will comply with the Connecticut Nutrition Standards during the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. This certification shall include all food offered for sale to students separately from reimbursable meals at all times and from all sources, including but not limited to, school stores, vending machines, school cafeterias, and any fundraising activities on school premises sponsored by the school or by non-school organizations and groups. The Board of Education will allow the sale to students of food items that do not meet the Connecticut Nutrition Standards and the sale to students of beverages not listed in Section 10-221q of the Connecticut General Statutes only when the following conditions are met: 1) the sale is in connection with an event occurring after the end of the regular school day or on the weekend; 2) the sale is at the location of the event; and 3) the food items are not sold from a vending machine or school store.
