We are not adding any teaching positions. We are actually moving people around the district. We want to restore a 4th grade teacher and also restore a World Language teacher at the Middle School. This is a crucial restore and not new positions. Mr. Smith also stated that we do not have a declining enrollment.

Mr. Smith encouraged everyone to read the email that he sent out regarding the Coronavirus. There was a conference call tonight at 5pm with the Governor, Emergency Services and Superintendent's. The state is doing the following: All activities are cancelled if more than 100 people. That means cancelling concerts, plays, etc. Mr. Smith noted that he isn't making that decision yet. We have home basketball games coming up, the Step Up Concert, a musical, etc. The Governor also stated that no state workers are to travel out of state for business. We have 2 out of state field trips that he is considering canceling those trips.
