#### Finish off the Summer with one more fitness event!

The YMCA in Middletown is hosting a youth triathlon event on **Sunday, August 27** for athletes of any experience entering grades 3 - 12. The proceeds of the event benefit My Time, a Middlesex YMCA scholarship program serving families who have been impacted by cancer. Details at: <u>https://www.midymca.org/my-time</u>.

The athletes will complete an open water swim, a multi-terrain closed bike course, and a run on the grounds of Camp Ingersoll in Portland. There is a 9:30 AM check-in and the heats begin at 10:30 AM. Parents or guardian must register at the Middlesex YMCA. (\$10 per athlete, \$20 per family)

#### <u>**REMINDER:**</u> Bring your license to visit our schools in order to visit/volunteer please.



Beginning the first day of school, all of our Main Offices (Memorial, Center, Middle School, and High School) will lock doors upon the start of the school day and continue to use the **<u>RAPTOR automated visitor</u>** management software. This system allows our school offices to confirm that visitors (parents, guests, repair persons) are who they say they are by requiring driver's license or other government-issued identification. This automated software instantly checks names against all registered sex offender lists in the United States or alerts related to court orders or child custody.

If you visited last year, your license is still on file with our computer system and you do not need to show your license. The program automatically does background checks each time you enter.

Please note: If you are changing schools you will need to show your license the first time in the new school as the program does not connect between the schools.

## **Thoughts**

## John Fidler (1957-2017)



If someone was to write a book, *The Art of Being John Fidler*, it would be well over one thousand pages featuring details on how to be kind, how to coach, how to lead, how to work hard, how to enjoy family, and how to enjoy life. But somehow for John himself, his own "book" by which he lived, was as simple as a message written on a napkin. He mastered the art of putting people at ease, pulling the best out of them, comforting them, and loving them without effort. It was natural and sincere.

John was a "chameleon" as a Principal. He could walk down the hall and see a student and be a mentor with a compliment. A little further down the hall, he would change and be a father to an upset student. In the same hallway, he was a consoler to a faculty member, giving them a quick word of encouragement with lasting effect. And, two steps later he could inspire a group of students with a smile and few words on a performance in which he had seen them. In a distance of 40 feet, John literally changed lives for the better. It was genuine, effortless, and meaningful.

After 27 years, it never got old for him. Every day, John loved being Principal of East Hampton High School. John loved his teachers. John loved his students. And everyone who ever came in contact with John, loved him back.

Anybody that met John once was a friend for life. Everyone felt a personal connection to John - regardless of how long he knew you. As soon as you met John, you were part of his list of friends for whom he would do anything. As people came together for the memorial tribute to John on the stairs of the school and during the calling hours at the school, it was a common story among the crowd that everyone felt that John was a true friend to them. That's the John Fidler that all of us loved – and all of us tried to emulate.

John's leadership style was, in a way – "devious," when you reflect on it. John didn't want to lead people. He wanted to better people – and he always did. He didn't lead teachers and staff members. He simply modeled what it was to show respect, care, kindness, and appreciation. People didn't follow John. They wanted to be like John. He inspired growth in the school and always deflected credit to the people he empowered with his mentorship. He never took credit for anything that happened in the school.

With a little smile on his face he always bragged about his teachers whether they were initiating interdisciplinary projects in the T-Bell, working on the NEASC Accreditation report, piloting the impressive Senior Capstone Projects, or promoting Special Olympics, Relay for Life, and Manis for a Cure (*Side note: imagine 6-foot 5-inches of John Fidler with painted pink fingernails*).

His love and admiration of our students is now and will be legendary. The stories of him (of which he would never tell) have come out this week of him driving to pick students up in the morning, delivering pizzas to them, and making every student feel connected to the school community. He had *passion* for those for whom sports and school was their priority, but he had genuine *compassion* for those who struggled and who might have not have graduated if John had not been a strong looming presence. Yes, John towered over many of us – if not all of us. But, in person, you never felt short next to John. He had a knack of making you feel like you were always speaking face-to-face with him.

John's love for his family was obvious and John's love for his students and teachers was obvious. But, John also loved everything that was East Hampton High School. Even the building was special to him – even in the midst of the heaviest parts of the renovation – because John saw what it would be and got everyone to believe in the finished product. Just like students who were going through difficulties, John saw what they could be and got every student to believe in themselves and the finished product they would be.

In a long life, if you change one person's life for the better, you have done the most important thing anyone can do. John Fidler changed lives every day. There were students who would not have graduated without his efforts. There were staff members who would not have blossomed because without his efforts. Every encounter he had with another person in school and out of school mattered.

John was a remarkable teacher, a remarkable coach, a remarkable principal, and a remarkable human being. John Fidler leaves behind a legacy of being admired for all the right reasons. The admiration for him was as a role model, as a family man, and as a great leader. As people continue to reflect on John's life and leadership, not only do they say it was a life well lived, it has been so common for people to say, "I want to be more like John Fidler."

We are all grateful that we benefited from John's dedication to school and town.



The loss of High School Principal, John Fidler has been a shock to us all; however, in a few short weeks we must be prepared to open our schools and be prepared for another year of teaching and learning.

With that said, Mrs. Nancy Briere has graciously agreed to act as Interim Principal of the High School through December 31. Nancy has served the district most recently as Interim Director of Curriculum following her years as Middle School Principal. Nancy's knowledge of the district, knowledge of the children, and knowledge of the high school programming and staff make her the perfect Interim during this difficult time. More important is the love she has for East Hampton and our school district as she takes on this new role in her continued "retirement."

In addition, to the team of Nancy and Michael Dalton – Assistant Principal, our current High School Director of Guidance, Kaitlin Sullivan will act as Dean of Students to offer additional support in the office. We have hired an additional Guidance Counselor for this school year.

And, a very special **THANK YOU** to the entire community of East Hampton.

On behalf of the teachers and staff of the East Hampton Public Schools, thank you to the Town of East Hampton. As we said goodbye to High School Principal, John Fidler, our school community was able to pull together to pay appropriate tribute and offer tremendous support to John's wife, sons, sisters, and parents. All of this was made possible by an outpouring of support and assistance by our town agencies, service organizations, and community members who were on site and standing by to honor John and his family.

We all take solace in knowing that East Hampton can come together in any crisis to offer support, assistance, and love.
