## **THE COMMUNITY**

East Hampton is located in Middlesex County, 20 miles south of the State Capitol in Hartford. It is equidistant from Boston and New York City—105 miles. It comprises 36.8 square miles and has a population of approximately 13,000. Conveniently located about 7 miles from two major highways Route 2 and 9, East Hampton's picturesque countryside along with its beautiful lake, has proven attractive to those who seek a typical New England small town with easy access to city centers. This ambiance has made it one of Middlesex County's fastest growing towns.

Historically, with the growth of manufacturing in the early to mid 1800's, East Hampton attracted entrepreneur William Barton. His creation of the first factory to manufacture bells led to East Hampton's recognition as the center of the bell making industry for the country. East Hampton soon became known as Belltown. One of the older firms, Bevin Brothers, (1832) is still in operation.
